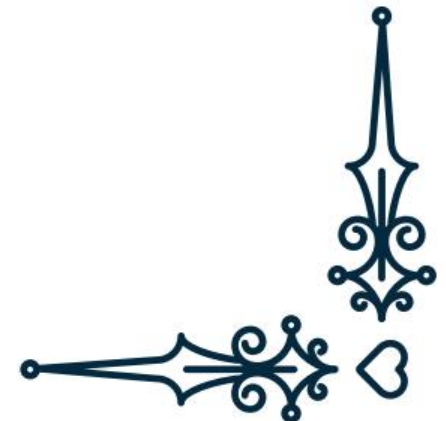
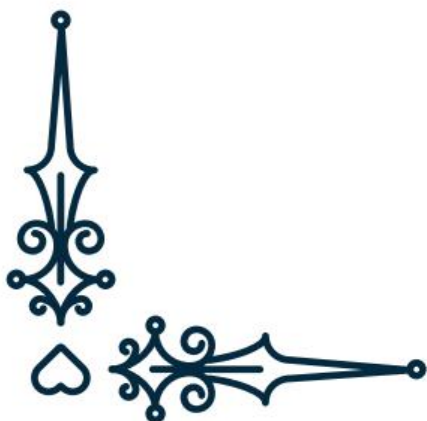

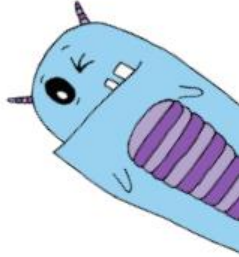

About the project

"Lords of the books" was the common initiative of youth from 3 European countries – Poland, Turkey, and Latvia. The project consisted of 3 phases:

- preparation;
- youth exchange;
- the phase of dissemination of results and summary of activities.



The aim of the project was:

- to gain new knowledge about our cultures through literature which is a part of the national cultural heritage;
- to become more aware of the cultural heritage and history of our countries;
- to encourage young people to read books, which are a source of knowledge about history, heritage, cultures, but also sources of positive attitudes and values such as tolerance, empathy or openmindedness;
- to show young people that reading books is a creative way of spending time and developing their imagination;

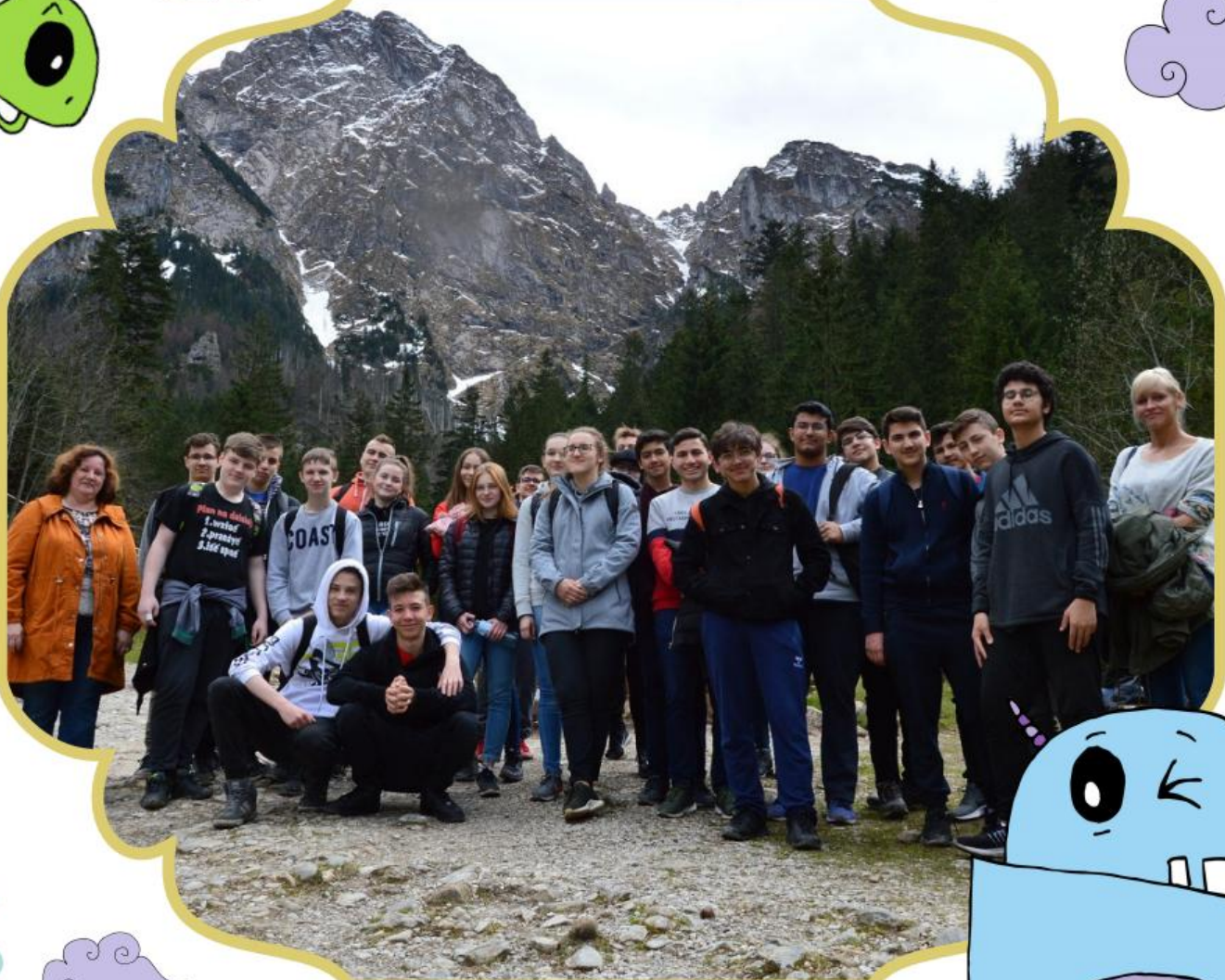
About the project

The project was attended by 36 people. Every group consists of 12 people – 2 group leaders and 10 participants. 24 people from our group are people with fewer opportunities.

Within the project, we took part in lots of activities based on non-formal education (team building games, thematic sessions, discussions, brainstorming, exchanging experience, presentations, city game, meetings with local community, evaluations, local and national evenings, etc.).

Within the project, we created a board game, based on European and native literature and a short movie promoting reading books among youth.

Thanks to our project, we as well as the youth from our local communities became more aware of our history and cultural heritage. We became more open to other cultures, tolerant, more related to our cultures and history.



About the youth exchange



"Lords of the books" was the project funded by the Erasmus + Programme, implemented between 9th of May and 15th of May 2019, by the non-governmental organization from Slawkow (Poland) – Stowarzyszenie – Porozumienie Pokolen. It was a trilateral youth exchange with the participation of 36 people (participants and group leaders).

Except Polish group, which is involved in the activities of Association, the project was attended by young people from the Latvian school „Rīgas Sergeja Zoltoka Vidusskola” and from the Turkish organisation „Bilgi ve Beceri Derneği”.

Main activities of the project took place in Poronin. The honorary patron of the project "Lords of the books" was taken by the Mayor of Slawkow – Rafał Adameczyk.



About the youth exchange

The aim of the youth exchange was to gain new knowledge about the culture of Latvia, Poland, and Turkey by analyzing and getting familiar with native literature, which is a part of the cultural heritage of our countries and to become more aware of the cultural heritage and our history. The international meeting was an idea to restore the popularity of reading books when the tradition of reading book disappears. The youth exchange showed also that literature and books are not only a source of knowledge about history, cultural heritage, cultures, but also about positive attitudes, and important values such as tolerance, empathy, and openness. Books are also a great idea for a more creative way of spending time.



The project was implemented in English using non-formal education methods (meetings, discussions, games and team building activities, thematic activities, city games, museum lessons, evaluations, national evenings).



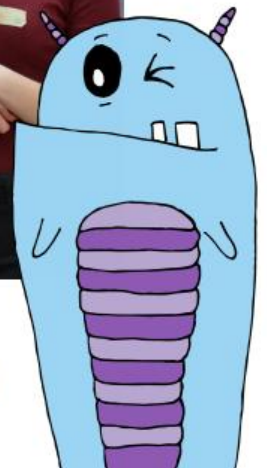
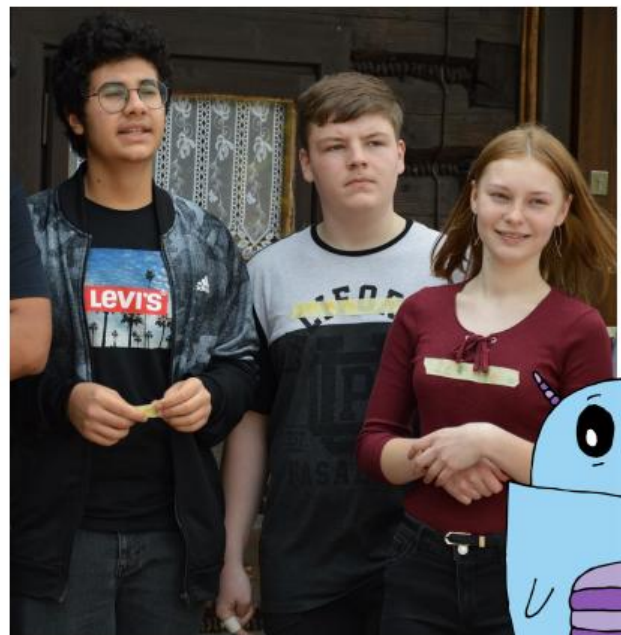
About the youth exchange

Participants prepared and took part in many creative activities that allowed them to broaden their knowledge and competencies in the field of the project's topic. As part of a city game, inspired by the literature of writers who were associated with Zakopane such as Stefan Żeromski, Kazimierz Przerwa-Tetmajer, Stanisław Ignacy Witkiewicz, Jan Kasprowicz and Kornel Makuszyński, the participants of the project visited the Museum of Kornel Makuszyński and the Tatra Museum. Within the youth exchange, each of the participating groups prepared their national evening, during which, in a creative way, was presented culture, traditions, dances, traditional cuisine, and regional costumes.



Time to open a new book

We officially started our youth exchange. As a Polish group, we prepared a short welcome for our partner groups, as well as an introduction to our international meeting. We reminded our schedule and tasks that we were implementing during the youth exchange, as well as the goals of our meeting.



The fellowship of the books

The next step of our youth exchange was to conduct integration activities (which we prepared during the preparation phase) that allowed us to remind our names, create a friendly atmosphere and create an integrated, international team. Together, we created a code of our youth exchange with common rules, that we were following during the meeting. Within the first session we defined also our fears and expectations regarding the youth exchange. Each of us created a list, which was presented and placed in a visible place in the workshop room. During the last day, within the final evaluation, we returned to our list of expectations and fears, analyzing them.



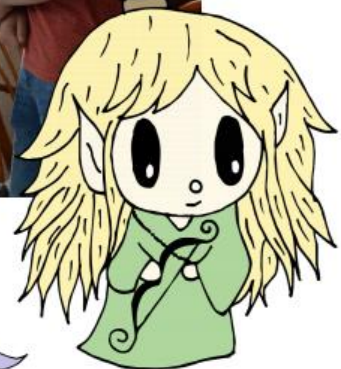
Make them unforgettable

Within the workshops, we analyzed the interviews we made during the creating of project. On the basis of the answers and comments that our colleagues gave us, we created the map of reasons why young people do not read books and what are the reasons that books are losing importance.



Secrets of books

We prepared and carried out thematic sessions which the main theme was our native literature, thanks to which we could learn about the history of our country, culture, and draw positive behaviors and values from it. Each of our groups prepared creative and interactive tasks, games, and puzzles (engaging everyone in action) related to native books, thanks to which we not only got more familiar with the culture of our countries, cultural heritage, history and positive behavior patterns, but also stimulated our curiosity, imagination and creativity. These workshops were also an inspiration to create a board game.



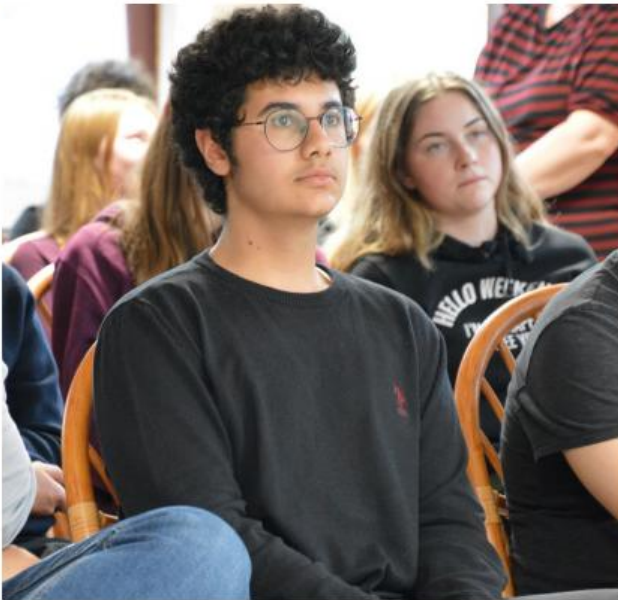
In the footsteps of cultural heritage

Within the youth exchange, we took part in the city game in Zakopane, which was prepared for us by our peers from the local school. The game was inspired by the literature of writers who were associated with Zakopane, such as Stefan Żeromski, Kazimierz Przerwa-Tetmajer, Stanisław Ignacy Witkiewicz, Jan Kasprowicz and Kornel Makuszyński. Within the game, we visited the Museum of Kornel Makuszyński and Tatra Museum. Thanks to the city game, we got familiar with the work of authors whose literary works are a cultural heritage and also got familiar with the unique folklore of Zakopane.



Take a step forward

Within the session we discussed how we can encourage young people to become more interested in literature as a source of knowledge about the culture, history, and traditions of our countries and how we can change the attitude of young people. Within the workshops, we could exchange our experience and thoughts. Within the workshops, we created the map with ideas on how we can contribute to an increase in the level of readership.



The Lord of the books

Within our youth exchange, we were working on creating the board game. Divided into smaller international groups, we worked on the concept of the game, board, characters/pawns for the game, dices, rules, creative tasks and challenges to the subject of the game. Thanks to these activities, we developed our art skills, but also creativity and innovation. Creating the game was a very difficult task, but we think we managed it and we are glad about our common work.



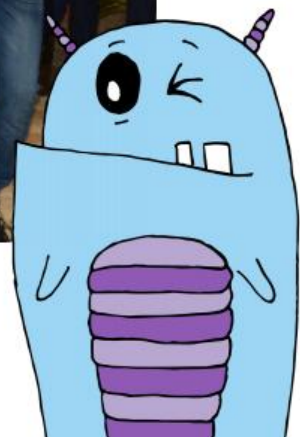
Afternoon with The Lord of the Books

We organized the literary afternoon in the convention of the board game. We invited our peers from the local school to participate in our activities. The main element of the meeting was a board game created by us. Within the meeting, we shared our experience, discuss Erasmus+ Programme and our youth exchange and presented our results of work. We presented also our board game and discuss the rules. The next step was to divide into smaller teams, in which we played together. Thanks to our meeting, we inspired our peers to spend time in a similar way: spending time exchanging experiences, discussing, reading books and getting familiar with our cultures, history, and traditions.



National evenings

Within the youth exchange, each of our teams prepared its national evening in a creative way. During the evenings, we could get familiar with the history of the dedicated country, culture, traditions, customs, traditional costumes, dances and tasted traditional dishes.



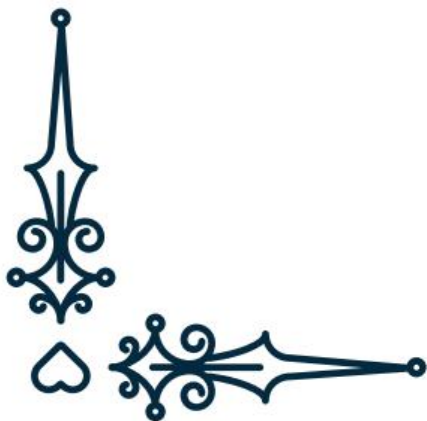
The last chapter

Turkish literature

Peyami Safa

Peyami Safa was a Turkish journalist, columnist, and novelist. He was born in April 1899 in Istanbul. He wrote 15 novels, excluding those written under a pseudonym. He also wrote 17 non-fictionals and 9 textbooks mostly about literature. His important books are *Şimşek* (1923), *Sözde Kızlar* (1923), *Mağşer* (1924), *Bir Akşamdı* (1924), *Süngülerin Gölgesinde* (1924), *Bir Genç Kız Kalbinin Cürmü* (1925), *Canan* (1925), *Dokuzuncu Hariciye Koğuşu* (1930), *Fatih-Harbiye* (1931), *Atilla* (1931), *Bir Tereddüdün Romanı* (1933), *Matmazel Nöraliya'nın Koltuğu* (1949), *Yalnızız* (1951), *Biz İnsanlar* (1959);



Dokuzuncu Hariciye Koğuşu

The first edition was published in 1930. It is an autobiography. It is one of the most famous books of Peyami Safa. It is about a fifteen years old child's illness. It is the first Turkish novel based on the observations of the novel hero.

Turkish literature

Sabahattin Ali

Sabahattin Ali was born on 25th of February 1907. He died on 2nd of April 1948. He was a Turkish novelist, short-story writer, poet, and journalist. He worked as a teacher in Yozgat, Aydin, Konya and Ankara for couple of years. In 1945, Ali started to publish humorous and opposing magazine *Mariko Pasa*. He arrested in 1948 for an article and sentenced for three months. Sabahattin Ali wanted to escape abroad, because government was chasing him all the time. A soldier called Ali Ertekin killed him when Ali was trying to escape from Turkey. This assassination still preserves its mystery.



Sabahattin Ali is one of the best novelists of Turkey for all the time. The novel, *Kürk Mantolu Madonna* is his masterpiece. He also wrote lots of poems and short stories; and translated some classic novels to Turkish. He expressed human strengths and weaknesses with a masterful style. His short novel "Madonna in A Fur Coat" (1943) is considered one of the best novellas in Turkish literature. Its translations have recently hit the best sellers lists and has sold record number of copies in his country of birth.

The important books of this author are: *Değirmen* (1935), *Kağı* (1936), *Ses* (1937), *Yeni Dünya* (1943), *Sırça Köşk* (1947), *Kuyucaklı Yusuf* (1937), *İçimizdeki Şeytan* (1940), *Kürk Mantolu Madonna* (1943);

Turkish literature

Mustafa Kemal Atatürk was born in 1881 in Salonica. He had a military training during his schools years. In the future, he continued his career as a soldier. He served as commander during the First World War. He wanted to take measures against the bad situation of the state and started his political life with the help of some of his friends. By establishing the assembly called TBMM, he initiated the war of liberation of the Turks.

Turkey has been set up and he became the first president of the republic. As the president of the newly formed Turkish Republic, Atatürk initiated a rigorous program of political, economic, and cultural reforms with the ultimate aim of building a modern, progressive, and secular nation-state. He made primary education free and compulsory, opening thousands of new schools all over the country. He also introduced the Latin-based Turkish alphabet, replacing the old Ottoman Turkish alphabet. Turkish women received equal civil and political rights during Atatürk's presidency ahead of many Western countries. He died in 1938 in Istanbul.

Nutuk was a speech delivered by Mustafa Kemal Atatürk from 15 to 20 October 1927, at the second congress of Cumhuriyet Halk Partisi. The speech covered the events between the start of the Turkish War of Independence on 19 May 1919, and the foundation of the Republic of Turkey, in 1923. It is an important source for the study of Kemalism. It took thirty-six hours (on a 6 day span) to be read by Atatürk.



Polish literature

Adam Mickiewicz was a Polish poet, dramatist, essayist, publicist, translator, professor of Slavic literature, and political activist. He lived in the era of Romanticism. He was born on December 24, 1798, in Żelazowa Wola, and died on November 26, 1855, in Istanbul. He wrote *Pan Tadeusz*, *Dziady*, *Reduta Ordona* and *Sonety Krymskie*. He is considered as one of the best Polish poets.



Pan Tadeusz is a Polish national epic poem. It tells the story of Polish noblemen during the Polish partitions. The book calls Poles to patriotism and reminds them of their nation.

Polish literature

Henryk Sienkiewicz was born on 5 May 1846, died on 15 November 1916. He was a Polish journalist, novelist and Nobel Prize laureate. He is best remembered for his historical novels, especially for his internationally known best-seller *Quo Vadis*. Sienkiewicz's literary career started in the age of positivism, and his biography was typical of this movement in terms of social background, education, early journalistic work for the Warsaw press, and involvement in public matters and charity work.



W pustyni i w puszczy is a popular young adult novel by Polish author and Nobel Prize-winning novelist Henryk Sienkiewicz written in 1911. It is the author's only novel written for children/teenagers. In *W pustyni i w puszczy* tells the story of two young friends, Stas Tarkowski (14 years old) and Nel Rawlison (8 years old), kidnapped by rebels during Mahdi's rebellion in Sudan. It was adapted for film twice, in 1973 and in 2001.

Polish literature

Aleksander Kaminski was born on 28 January 1903 in Warsaw, died on 15 March 1978. He was a teacher, educator, professor of humanities, co-founder of Cub Scouts methodology, scout instructor, scoutmaster, a soldier of the Home Army and one of the ideological leaders of the Grey Ranks, chairman of the Presidium of the Supreme Council of the Polish Scouting Association.



Kamienie na szaniec is a 1943 non-fiction novel by Polish writer Aleksander Kaminski. Published by the Polish underground press during the World War II occupation of Poland, the book describes the acts of sabotage and armed resistance carried out by the Polish underground scout movement, the Grey Ranks, of whom Kaminski was one of the instructors and leaders. Already immensely popular during World War II, after the war the book entered the canon of Polish literature and remains a recommended reading text for Polish students in the secondary school curriculum. It was adapted into two feature films, in 1978 and in 2014.

Latvian literature

Imants Ziedonis (he was born May 3, 1933, died February 27, 2013) – one of the most influential personalities of the Latvian culture in 20th century, incredibly popular Latvian poet, prose and scriptwriter, translator, a major contributor to The Third Latvian National Awakening (the social movement that led to the restoration of Latvia's independence). He published his first book of poems in 1961, and hence he has been a prolific writer with more than 20 collections of poems and seven books of fairy tales published. His philosophical, multidimensional fairy tales have received several international awards.



The book consists of a collection of phrases that make you go into deeper thought. Each phrase itself has no connections for they were written over time and in the spur of an inspirational moment of thought. Most of them have one meaning and one goal, but the end result will have you contemplating their meaning.

Latvian literature

Mara Zālīte (she was born February 18, 1952) is a well-known Latvian writer and cultural worker. Her literary works include poetry, essays, plays, drama, prose, and librettos. They often deal with historical problems and have symbolic meanings that correspond with mythology and Latvian culture and people. The writer has earned many literary prizes and national awards, including the Order of the Three Stars, and is considered as one of the greatest Latvian social figures. Her first prose work – the autobiographical novel "Five fingers", earned wide recognition from both readers and members of the writing community.



"Five fingers" tells the story of a girl who moves between worlds in the hopes of finding a Latvia that she can call home. Five years old Laura was born in one of Joseph Stalin's prison camps in Siberia. When Laura comes to Latvia nothing is like mom said.

Latvian literature

John Gaunsudrabins was born on 25th of August 1877 and died on 28 August 1962. He was a Latvian writer, painter, book illustrator and one of the first Latvian art theorists and critics. Member and Chairman of the Independent Artists' Unit. Most famous works of the author are "The White Paper", "Aija", "The Farmer and the Devil";



"Balta gramata" is a hearty but unexplored journey of memory, without repentance, reproach, moralization, or search for "lost paradise". The family is scarce, the father died, and when the mother has to sell the only cow, they often have only bread crushed in water for dinner. Gancis looks at the apples for a long time in the owner's garden, and herring is the greatest delicacy for him. Gancim must spend the winter in the room because his mother cannot provide him with proper clothes and shoes. And yet Ganch's childhood is happy as it can be happy for a poor child of a servant, whose mother has little time to take with her because work is working. Unity, the desire for reading, the adult stories in the long autumn and winter evenings – it all inspired the child's imagination and laid the foundation for the writer's talent.

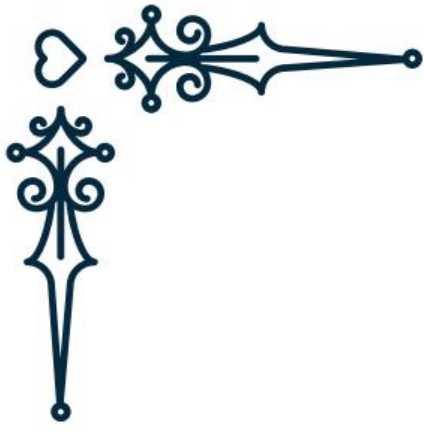

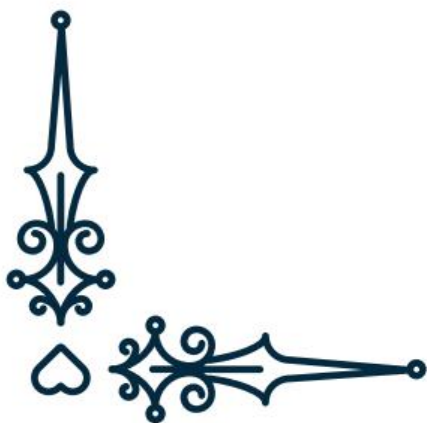

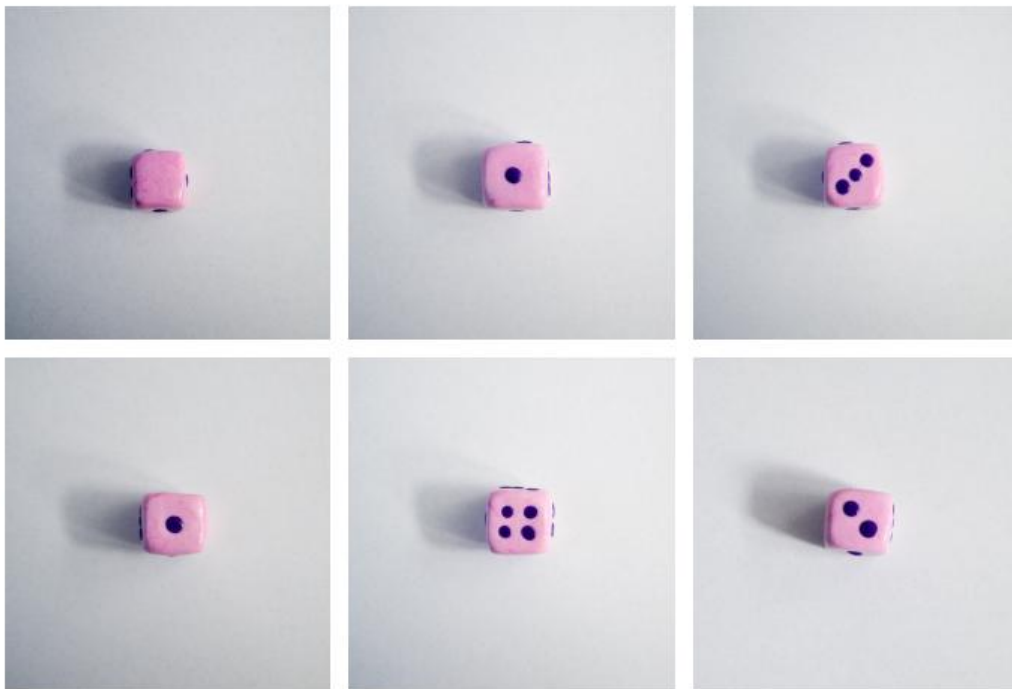
There are two dice. Each has five fields with numbers. The numbers correspond to the number of fields you can move to. There is also the empty field which equals zero. If you have a result of one empty field – you are waiting one round. If you throw two empty fields, it means you are coming back to the start field.

There are 5 special fields + the boss field which are part of the story:

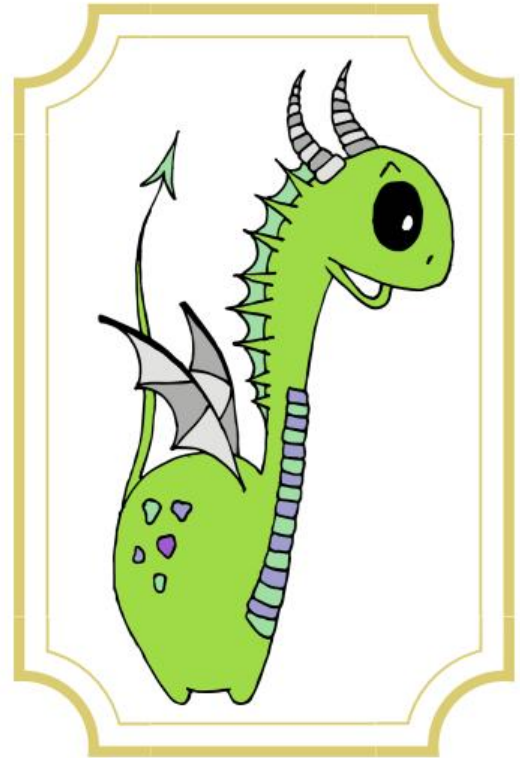
- Cave: there is a big bat guarding the entrance. If you want to pass you have to answer his question.
- Castle: there are two guardians who love books. But you can't pass them because they are discussing a book. Help them to answer the question to go further.
- Swamp: a swamp monster who is a pacifist and vegan wants to be scary. Key to success is knowledge, tell him an answer so he knows more and be more frightening.
- Tower: a beautiful princess closed herself in the tower, she had an argument with her grandma, who is waiting under the tower. She has one big question, answering means that maybe she will talk to her grandma and leave the tower.
- Forest: a little magical creature „solveeater“ is hiding somewhere in the bushes. Only he can tell you how to get out of the forest. On the ground, you see an old book of questions. Pawns and Dices

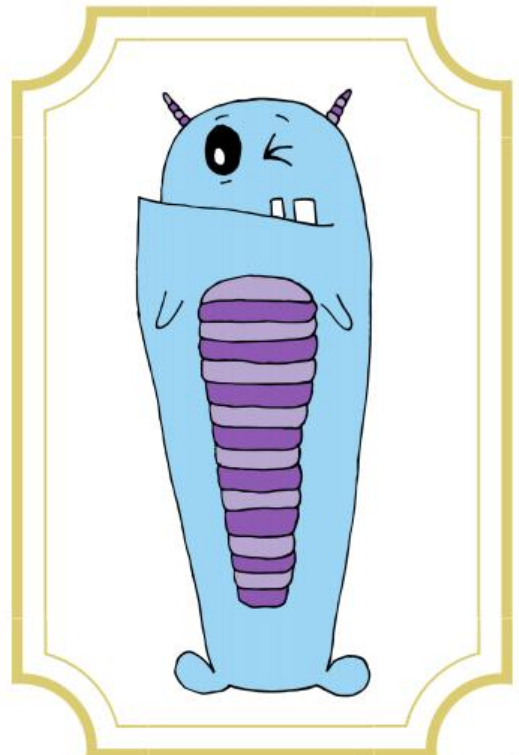
